

## **Winning Home Board Member Honored for Volunteer Work**

WOBURN, Feb. 5, 2025 - Robert E. Maguire has been named Volunteer of the Year by the James L. McKeown Boys & Girls Club of Woburn for his many contributions of time and effort to the community of Woburn. It is the first such award made by the club and will become an annual tradition.

The highly successful event brought together hundreds of children and their families on a sunny September day for carousel rides, rock climbing, fun house tours, pony rides, face painting, games, a petting zoo, free lunch and snacks, and more. In keeping with Winning Home's commitment to children, all events were free of charge.

"Over the years Bob has given generously of his time to make Woburn a safe, enriching community for everyone who lives here," said Julie Gage, executive director of the Boys & Girls Club. "He is a member of our board of incorporators," she said, "and we are incredibly fortunate to have him on our team."

In addition to his volunteer work for the Boys & Girls Club and Winning Home, Maguire has served almost 20 years as trustee of the Woburn Public Library, including 11 years as president. He is a founding member of the Woburn Community Educational Foundation and has been part of that valued organization for 10 years. He has worked extensively with the Woburn Historical Society, which produces videos and publications about the city's agricultural, industrial and cultural past and is co-author of Woburn: Forgotten Tales and Untold Stories, published by Sonrel Press of Woburn in 2004.
